The Fingerprints of God Order Demands Intelligence

It is meaningless to know that this Being is supremely intelligent.

The only knowledge of merit is singular: is He supremely beneficent? A universe full of circumstantial evidence cannot answer even one of these questions!! Only God himself, communicating overtly empirically (-no hide— and seek), can answer these The inquiry questions. regarding the existence of God thus resolves into but one ultimate question: has this entity, in fact, directly
